



## Napa Valley College Criminal Justice Training Center

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### Criminal Justice Training Center Instructor – Part Time Open-Continuous

**Position:** Academy instructors are part-time hourly faculty members of Napa Valley College. Instructors are assigned to teach blocks of instruction in classes offered by the criminal justice training center that may include the basic police academy, fish and game academy, basic dispatch course, or in-service training classes. Assignments are based on the needs of the training center and qualifications, training, and experience of the instructor.

#### Minimum Qualifications:

- ❑ Six years of full time law enforcement experience and an earned associates degree from an accredited college or university, or two years of full time law enforcement experience and an earned bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.
- ❑ Have successfully completed a P.O.S.T. certified Basic Course Instructional Skills class and be currently certified as a P.O.S.T. Basic Course Instructor.
- ❑ Be a role model by setting a moral and ethical example.

Note: Applicants interested in teaching firearms, chemical agents, weaponless defense, impact weapons, driving, or physical fitness must have completed a P.O.S.T. certified instructor course in the specific discipline within the last three years or be current within that discipline for a law enforcement agency prior to being assigned at the training center.

#### Desirable Qualifications:

- ❑ Demonstrated knowledge of adult learning methods.
- ❑ Experience working as a law enforcement instructor.

**Selection Process:** Applicants must submit a letter of interest, resume, and one letter of recommendation from a supervisor. Applicants meeting the minimum qualifications will be invited for an interview with the academy director and academy coordinators. The college Office of Instruction must approve applicants selected for further consideration. The College Board of Trustees makes all hiring appointments.
